Independent research brief, not advocacy. Claims follow free multi-source evidence (scholarly OpenAlex + official/open seeds). Citizen discourse (X) was not collected for cost reasons; attitude claims stay insufficient. Human-reviewed before publish; not auto-published Topics scores. Thesis-style structure: claims only with evidence, confidence, and falsifiers.

1 · Research question

Under what conditions, and over what time scales, can AI and US–Israeli technology meaningfully affect governance, economy, and attitudes in post-collapse Lebanon — and where do structural constraints (elite capture, proxy politics, demography, identity) bound those effects?

2 · Corpus (pilot free collect)

Terminology: English lead = **corrupt patronage system**; local name **wasta** (■ ■ ■ ■ ■) = existing corrupt access system into government, national entities, and judiciary — often treated as social fabric in Lebanon.

3 · Method (short)

Research → evidence synthesis → claims. Four layers: (1) discourse, (2) official narratives as objects of analysis, (3) structural constraint matrix, (4) conditional scenarios. Claims only with evidence mix + confidence + falsifier. Prior Elenchos Topics/Trackers (R) are optional reference only, never primary spine. High-scrutiny for state-linked media and regional info-ops literature.

4 · Findings (from S + O)

- **Official path (O):** reform + aid + security partnership; IMF/WB banking and fiscal conditionality as speed-limiters. AI / Israeli tech cooperation is not a dominant official seed narrative in this free pack.
- **Structural floors (S):** banking/deposit trust, electricity, parallel armed power, and corrupt patronage (*wasta*) bind “fast AI transformation” claims.
- **Tech role:** conditional accelerator under reform + power + security settlement — not an independent cause of recovery or deradicalization.
- **Gaps:** citizen side incomplete without D; digital anti-corruption at high risk of capture if elite incentives stay unchanged.

5 · Structural constraint matrix

6 · Claims (human-reviewed 2026-07-30)

Approved for this brief after owner human gate. Not population polls. T4 remains insufficient (no D).

T1 Governance · confidence: medium

Digital/AI governance tools alone are unlikely to dismantle Lebanon’s corrupt patronage (*wasta*) system without concurrent elite and enforcement change.

Falsifier: Sustained independent digital enforcement that measurably reduces patronage access without elite turnover.

T2 Speed / floors · confidence: medium–high
Official recovery paths (IMF/WB reform + aid) are bounded by banking resolution and infrastructure; “fast” recovery narratives that ignore these floors are not supported by S+O.
Falsifier: Rapid recovery metrics while banking remains unresolved and power intermittent.

T3 AI ceiling · confidence: medium
AI administration faces a hard ceiling under electricity and parallel-state constraints.
Falsifier: Reliable national e-government under the current power and security arrangement.

T4 Attitudes · confidence: insufficient
Insufficient evidence in this pilot to claim AI or US–Israeli tech changes mass attitudes toward neighbors/Israel; literature points to long timescales and security preconditions.
Falsifier: Longitudinal discourse + surveys showing rapid attitude shift under tech-only interventions.

T5 Economy conditional · confidence: medium
Conditional recovery with external tech is plausible under security + banking settlement scenarios (B/C), not under continuity capture (A).
Falsifier: Large dual-use investment boom under full proxy veto and frozen deposits.

T6 Proxy / sovereignty · confidence: medium–high
Incomplete state monopoly of force is a binding constraint on reform depth; official sovereignty language does not by itself remove it.
Falsifier: Deep reform implementation while parallel arms remain decisive.

7 · Conditional scenarios

Scenario	Politics	Tech may accelerate	Unlikely fast
A Continuity capture	Same elite + proxy veto	Apps, service PR	Corruption culture, hate norms, demography
B Constrained reform	Partial sovereignty + external leverage	Ag, digital admin, growth pockets	Full deradicalization
C Strategic realignment	Sustained anti-proxy + pro-normalcy	Fast dual-use & infrastructure with continuity	Highly state without security monopoly

None is destiny. Discourse support for A/B/C is unknown without D; constraint binding from S is high under A, medium under B, lower under C if security settles.

8 · Limits & open work

- No live citizen (X) sample — do not invent street percentages.
- Lebanese government primary digital/AI strategy docs thin in free O pack.
- OpenAlex S is literature density, not a meta-score of “severity.”
- Optional next: thin X (mode=x) for Chapter 5; more Lebanese-gov primary O via manual seeds.
